






RE-OPENING TRINITY CHURCH SURVEY RESULTS


WHAT HAS BEEN THE BEST THING ABOUT OUR ONLINE WORSHIP SERVICES?

- Not seeing people



- It all depends on how the crisis of this COVID-19. As for now I will be worshipping online.






OTHER RESPONSES...

- There are few or no new cases and we honor comfort zones for everyone present
- We still have to be six feet apart.

IN-PERSON WORSHIP?**


